Self-stigma refers to the negative attitudes, including internalized shame, that people with mental illness have about their own condition. Institutional stigma, is more systemic, involving policies of government and private organizations that intentionally or unintentionally limit opportunities for people with mental illness.

Where stigma, negative attitudes and stereotyping result in discrimination, they will contravene the Code. Organizations and individuals have a legal obligation under the Code to not discriminate against people with mental health or addiction issues, and to eliminate discrimination when it happens.

Stigma is when someone sees you in a negative way because of a particular characteristic or attribute, such as mental illness. When someone treats you in a negative way because of your mental illness, this is discrimination. Treating all people with respect and dignity means not judging, labelling or discriminating against them based on any personal attribute, including mental illness.
